2. Disaster Leave Agreement

A resolution placing teacher, Carl Nowlin, on temporary suspension and leave of absence (Disaster Leave Agreement) pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 122A.40, Subdivision 12 was presented for approval.

A motion was made by Don Siggelkow and seconded by Laura Oksnevad to approve The Disaster Leave Agreement, as presented. The motion carries 6-0.

DISCUSSION

1. ADSIS (Alternative Delivery of Specialized Instructional Services)

As a follow up the February 3, 2015 ADSIS presentation, Principal Renee Corneille and Principal Kari Page presented three options for the proposed ADSIS application. The options considered were to eliminate ADSIS, continue the program as is or continue the current program adding additional reading support at the Middle School. The Board supported the last option of applying for money for the current program and additional reading support at the Middle School for grades 7 and 8. Principal Corneille and Principal Page will submit the application by the April 16, 2015 deadline. The State contribution to the ADSIS program for this option will be approximately \$260,000 of funding to cover FTE's, capital and supply costs. The District contribution for this option will increase to approximately \$110,000. If our application is not successful, the School Board agreed to continue their current investment of approximately \$96,000 to the program for the 2015 – 2016 school year. Currently the ADSIS program reaches 132 students in our District who fall in the lowest percentile of the NWEA MAP test.

2. EL (English Learners)

Principal Renee Corneille, Principal Kari Page and Anna Nagle presented an update to the Board on the District's EL program. Currently the District has identified 122 students speaking 24 different languages that receive EL services. Programming, approved by the Board, allows for a 2.0 FTE at Wilshire Park serving 58 students with direct service, and a 1.0 FTE at the secondary building serving 42 students; 27 receive direct service at the middle school and 15 students at the high school receive direct service, of the secondary students, 3 students receive indirect service. Each student must be assessed in reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. The speaking test, 30 minutes per student, must be administered by the licensed EL teacher. There is new EL Legislation extending EL eligibility from 5 years to 6 years, multiple measures will now be used to determine EL status. There will be an EL continuing education component requirement added to teacher licensure. The Board has requested an additional update on the EL program once the test scores come in.

3. Personnel

Based on the budget discussion from the March 3, 2015 meeting, Superintendent Laney reported five probationary teachers will be non-renewed. The Board will take action on the probationary non-renewals at the April 7, 2015 School Board meeting.

4. Policy 714 – Fund Balances

This was the first reading of Policy 714 – Fund Balances. Suggested edits were discussed. Additional edits will be considered. A second reading of this policy will occur at the April 7th School Board meeting.
