A motion was made by Leah Slye and seconded by Laura Oksnevad to approve the Minutes from the September 12, 2017 Regular School Board Meeting and the September 19, 2017 Regular School Board Meeting and School Board Retreat, as presented. The motion carries 5-0.

CONSENT AGENDA

A motion was made by Laura Oksnevad and seconded by Cassandra Palmer to approve the October 3, 2017 Consent Agenda, as presented. The motion carries 5-0.

ACTION

1. Assurance of Compliance

This was the annual review of the Assurance of Compliance of State and Federal Laws prohibiting discrimination of students and employees of the District.

A motion was made by Leah Slye and seconded by Andrea Scamehorn to approve the Assurance of Compliance, as presented. <u>The motion carries 5-0</u>

2. Early Childhood Special Education Transportation

Concerns regarding our current transportation programming for our youngest learners are amplified due to the increase in the District's early childhood special education programming. A leasing option for two 10-passenger vans was presented as a fiscally responsible solution.

A motion was made by Leah Slye and seconded by Laura Oksnevad to approve the proposal of leasing two 10-passenger vans for the District's early childhood special education students, as presented. The motion carries 5-0.

3. Policy 206 - Public Participation in School Board Meetings

This was the second reading of Policy 206 – Public Participation in School Board Meetings.

A motion was made by Cassandra Palmer and seconded by Laura Oksnevad to approve Policy 206 – Public Participation in School Board Meetings, as presented. The motion carries 5-0.

4. Amendment to Bond Parameters Resolution

RESOLUTION AMENDING SEPTEMBER 19, 2017 PARAMETERS RESOLUTION AND REMOVING RESTRICTIONS ON THE ROLE OF THE INDEPENDENT MUNICIPAL ADVISOR

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 282, State of Minnesota, as follows:

WHEREAS, on September 19, 2017, the Board adopted a parameters resolution authorizing the approval of the sale of General Obligation School Building Bonds, Series 2017A and retaining PFM Financial Advisors LLC ("PFM") to act as an independent municipal advisor to provide bond pricing opinion services for that issue; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to broaden PFM's role as an independent municipal advisor;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 282, State of Minnesota, as follows:

- 1. Section 2 of the parameters resolution adopted September 19, 2017 is amended to read as follows:
 - 2. The School Board, desires to proceed with the sale of the Bonds by direct negotiation to Robert W. Baird & Co. (herein "Baird"). Baird will purchase the Bonds in an arm's-length commercial transaction with the District. The School Board has determined to retain PFM Financial Advisors LLC to act as an independent municipal advisor for this issue.

A motion was made by Andrea Scamehorn and seconded by Cassandra Palmer to approve the Resolution Amending September 19, 2017 Parameters Resolution and removing restrictions on the role of the Independent Municipal Advisor, as presented. The motion carries 6-0. DISCUSSION 1. World's Best Workforce, A&I, ADSIS, and Title Update St. Anthony Middle School Principal Renee Corneille provided an update to the Board on the five components of the World's Best Workforce, including the District's goals associated with each component. Achievement and Integration, Title Funding, and ADSIS were also discussed. The document will be posted on the District's website. 2. Policy 212 - School Board Member Development This was the first reading of Policy 212 - School Board Member Development. There were no changes. This policy will be presented for approval on October17, 2017. 3. Policy 213 – School Board Committees This was the first reading of Policy 213 - School Board Committees. There were no changes.
