APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A motion was made by Barry Kinsey and seconded by Laura Oksnevad to approve the September 16, 2014 Agenda, as presented. <u>The motion carries</u>.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Mike Volna and seconded by Don Siggelkow to approve the Minutes from the September 2, 2014 Regular Meeting, as presented. <u>The motion carries</u>.

CONSENT AGENDA

A motion was made by Andrea Scamehorn and seconded by Barry Kinsey to approve the September 16, 2014 Consent Agenda, as presented. <u>The motion carries</u>.

ACTION

1. Preliminary 2014 Pay 2015 Levy Certification

Each year in September the School Board is required to certify the property tax impact for the upcoming school year. The Minnesota Department of Education has not released levy calculations for the 2014 Pay 2015 Levy. The recommended motion was to certify the Preliminary 2014 Pay 2015 Levy at the maximum amount. Certifying the maximum on the preliminary levy gives the School Board the option to certify less than the max on the final levy in December. Levy amounts will be sent to the School Board along with the

certification form once released by MDE. The deadline for submission of the preliminary levy certification form to Hennepin and Ramsey Counties, as well as MDE, is September 30th.

A motion was made by Barry Kinsey and seconded by Mike Volna to certify the Preliminary 2014 Pay 2015 Levy at the maximum amount, as presented. The motion carries.

2. Policy 413 – Harassment and Violence

This was the second reading of School Board Policy 413 dealing with Harassment and Violence. The only change was to identify Wendy Webster as Human Rights Officer. This is a policy the Board reviews on an annual basis.

A motion was made by Laura Oksnevad and seconded by Don Siggelkow to approve Policy 413 – Harassment and Violence, as presented. <u>The motion carries</u>.

3. Policy 522 - Nondiscrimination of Students Based on Gender

This was the second reading of School Board Policy 522 dealing with Nondiscrimination of Students Based on Gender. There were a number of changes made to this policy related to the title change. This is a policy the Board reviews on a regular basis.

A motion was made by Andrea Scamehorn and seconded by Laura Oksnevad to approve Policy 522 – Nondiscrimination of Students Based on Gender, as presented. <u>The motion carries</u>.

1. 2014 – 2015 Budget Timeline

Director of Business Services Bill Menozzi presented an update to the draft Budget timeline for the 2014 – 2015 school year. As outlined in the timeline, Mr. Menozzi will be presenting the First Quarter Budget Update at the October 7th School Board Meeting.

2. Bussing

 Director of Business Services Bill Menozzi presented an update on the District's transportation process. This is the second year with Metropolitan Transportation Network and the first year having the routes completed in house. The school year started with a route running late but that has since been resolved.

3. Policy 104 - School District Vision/Mission Statement

This was the first reading of School Board Policy 104 dealing with the District's Mission, Vision, Values and Strategic Objectives. The changes to this policy are related to the strategic planning work that was done last year. A second reading of Policy 104 and recommendation for approval will be presented at the October 7th School Board Meeting.

4. Strategic Planning
Superintendent Laney outlined the next steps in the Strategic Planning process. Specific details regarding School Board goals will be discussed at a retreat planned for September 27 th .
