We are now at a point with distance-learning where we are sharing end-of-school-year details. Beginning Tuesday, May 26, through the last day of school on June 4, distance learning and class assignments will look a little different. For the last eight days of the 2019-20 school year, teachers have been asked to reflect upon what we've learned in this time of distance learning, capturing that knowledge so that collectively we can continue to make enhancements to education for all students.

Please know that during these last eight days, students and families will still have access to connect with their teachers. Students will still be required to sign-in to attendance each day, taking the time to finish independent projects and/or missing work.

Technology return June 4-5, June 8

- Families have the option to keep their Chromebooks over the summer. However, families who do want to return their Chromebooks can drop them off from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., Thursday, June 4, Friday, June 5, and Monday, June 8, at the high school/middle school building, door 1. Chromebooks should be dropped off in a bag with the charger (if one was given out).
- All Hot Spots will need to be returned by placing them into a bag and dropping them off at door 1 of the middle/high school building.
