2021 Legislative Priorities

- Eliminate instructional hour/seat time requirements to allow for implementation of new and innovative learning models.
- Allow districts to use October 2019 enrollment number for funding if higher than October 2020 due to coronavirus (COVID-19).
- Do not require voter approval for levy renewals.
- Read the Association of Metropolitan School Districts (AMSD) position paper on statewide assessments.
- Increase flexibility of access to School Board meetings by continuing remote/virtual access. This will help ease equity and accessibility issues; generate more family and community engagement; and provide additional flexibility for those interested in running for office that may not be able to attend all in-person School Board meetings.

Community Services— provides early childhood programs for children ages birth to five years, including Early Childhood Family Education classes, half-day and all-day preschool for children three- to five-years of age. Also provides before- and after-school care for youth in kindergarten through grade five, as well as after-school youth programming and activities for adults and senior citizens.

Wilshire Park Elementary School— serving students in kindergarten through grade five. Our mission focuses on how students will be valued and provided an individualized educational experience. We will form strong partnerships with students, parents and families.
